OUR SCHOOL

School Profile

With just over 550 students, North Smithfield High School provides a highly personalized learning environment. We believe in multidisciplinary and applied learning. In addition to working with our dedicated teachers, NSHS students get to discover new possibilities, skills, and talents by working with mentors and exploring career and life possibilities through internships.

North Smithfield High School routinely scores among the top schools in English Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science on state assessment exams as well as on the SAT. The US News and World Reports annual "Best High Schools in the US" routinely places North Smithfield High School among the highest-ranked public high schools in Rhode Island.

Academic Profile

North Smithfield High School is accredited by the New England Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges (NEASAC) and employs 45 faculty members, 2 counselors, 3 administrators, a school nurse, and a school psychologist.

Students in the Class of 2024 must earn 23 credits to graduate. North Smithfield High School utilizes a weighted 4.0 Grade Point Average (GPA) system for class rank while also reporting a traditional unweighted GPA. Special Education, Support classes, Senior Project & Physical Education/Health classes are excluded from these calculations.

The final rank for seniors is computed at the end of the first semester of their senior year. This system places different weights on classes designated as AP, Honors, College Prep, and Fundamentals. Students earn .5 credits per course, each semester. No credit is earned for grades below 65.

North Smithfield High School applicants respond honestly and fully to questions regarding disciplinary incidents. We report discipline out to colleges and universities.

Close to 50% of NSHS students participate in our music programs.

Senior Project

Senior Project is an NSHS Graduation Requirement that affords students the opportunity to gain a rich and authentic learning experience in any field or topic of interest to them.

Senior Project is broken down into the following components:

- at least 15 hours of fieldwork completed under the guidance of a mentor who is an expert in the area of study
- a 6-8 page research paper that links to the fieldwork
- a completed Senior Project Portfolio
- a culminating presentation of the work the student has done

Senior project topics over the years have included student-run non-profit events, academic-based research and discovery, reaching personal goals, and career-focused explorations.

CTE PROGRAMS

North Smithfield High School offers 3 CTE Programs in Business & Finance, Music, and Pre-Engineering.

Business & Finance

Students will prepare for careers in the Governor's Workforce Board priority sector of Business Management, Administration & Finance, and entry-level careers as an accounting clerk or an entry-level bank employee and is a strong foundation for those intending to pursue further post-secondary education.


<u>Music</u>


Pre-Engineering
